About the service

Inch View is a 60-bed care home for older people, based in the Gilmerton area of Edinburgh. The service is provided by the City of Edinburgh Council and has been registered by the Care Inspectorate since 01 April 2011.

At the time of inspection, the care home was providing care for 59 people.

About the inspection

This was a follow up inspection which took place on 22 February 2024, following on from the initial inspection on 28 June 2023. The inspection was carried out by an inspector from the Care Inspectorate. To prepare for the inspection we reviewed information about this service. This included previous inspection findings, registration information, information submitted by the service and intelligence gathered since the last inspection.

In making our evaluations of the service we:

- Spoke with 2 staff and management
- Observed practice and daily life
- Reviewed documents

Key messages

- The environmental issues had been appropriately actioned
- Medication rooms were within appropriate temperature ranges
- The designated smoking lounge had a new robust extractor fan
- Damaged fire doors had been repaired

How good is our setting? 3 - Adequate

We evaluated this key question as adequate, where strengths only just outweighed weaknesses.

We observed improvements in the outstanding requirement from the initial inspection from 28 June 2023.

Faulty fire doors had been repaired and were in working order, ensuring safety for people experiencing care.

Air conditioning units had been installed in the medication room, ensuring that medication was stored at appropriate temperatures.

An improved, powerful extractor fan had been installed within the designated smoking lounge, which had significantly improved air quality in the surrounding areas of the care home.

These improvements have had a positive impact on the environment for people experiencing care, staff and visitors.

What the service has done to meet any requirements we made at or since the last inspection

Requirements

Requirement 1

Requirement made at the initial inspection on 28 June 2023:

By 06 October 2023, the provider must ensure that people experience high quality facilities, that are kept in a good state of repair externally and internally; and have adequate and suitable ventilation.

To do this the provider must as a minimum:

a) Ensure that all fire doors comply with the Fire Scotland report of 17th March 2023

b) Ensure that ventilation in the designated smoking area is sufficient to ensure secondary smoke does not impact on people

c) Ensure that medication is stored within the acceptable temperature range within medication manufacturers guidance.

This is to comply with regulation 10 (1) and (2)(b) and (c) (Fitness of premises) of The Social Care and Social Work Improvement Scotland (Requirements for Care Services) Regulations 2011 (SSI 2011/210).

This is to ensure that people experience high quality facilities which are consistent with Health and Social Care Standards (HSCS) 5.19 which states; "My environment is secure and safe", and (HSCS) 5.24 which states; "I experience an environment that is well looked after with clean, tidy and well maintained premises, furnishings and equipment".

This requirement was made on 28 June 2023.

Action taken on previous requirement

- Work had taken place to repair issues with fire doors.
- Ventilation had been improved in the designated smoking area ensuring that secondary smoke did not impact on people.
- Air Conditioning units had been installed within medication rooms, this had ensured that medication was stored within the acceptable temperature range within medication manufacturers guidance.
